Subject : **A Directive to Principals/School Heads to Assemble Their Respective General Parent-Teacher Associations (GPTAs) and Other Stakeholders to Adopt Measures to Help Prevent the Spread of Dengue Infection**

1. This Memorandum, supplementary to Memorandum No. 215, s. 2019 issued on September 3, 2019, aims to address the **Dengue Surveillance Report** of the Provincial Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (**PESU**) of the Provincial Health Office of Tarlac covering Morbidity Weeks 30 to 33 which put six **(6) barangays** in Tarlac City as "**Hot Spots**" for Dengue Infection, namely:

- a. Bantog
- b. San Jose
- c. San Rafael
- d. San Vicente
- e. Suizo
- f. Tibagan

and **14 barangays** in Tarlac City as "**Clustering of Cases**" for Dengue Infection, namely:

- a. Aguso
- b. Baras-Baras
- c. Burot
- d. Care

- e. Central
- f. Laoang
- g. Lourdes
- h. Maliwalo
- i. Matatalaib
- j. San Isidro
- k. San Miguel
- l. San Roque
- m. Sapang Maragul
- n. Tibag

2. Principals/School Heads **covered** by the aforementioned Report are directed to assemble their respective GPTAs and stakeholders to adopt the “**Four o-clock Habit**” which put into practice “**Mag 4S Kontra Dengue**” and to formulate other strategies such as improvement of environmental sanitation, clean-up campaign and the like. Members of the Health and Nutrition Unit of the Tarlac City Schools Division will attend such assemblies after appropriate scheduling.
3. Principals/School Heads **not covered** by the Report are also advised to adopt and formulate the abovementioned strategies.
4. Wide and immediate dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
